WHEREAS, the Township of Parsippany-Troy Hills is eligible to receive Federal funds available through the Department of Housing and Urban Development; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development requires certain certifications to be submitted along with and as part of the Consolidated Plan Submission; and

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WHEREAS, pursuant to government regulations the Township of Parsippany-Troy Hills has prepared the required submission to apply for Community Development Block Grant funds for fiscal year 2013.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Council of the Township of Parsippany-Troy Hills, in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey, being the governing body thereof, as follows:

1. The Mayor of the Township of Parsippany-Troy Hills is hereby authorized to submit the application for Community Development Funding, including all understandings and assurances contained therein, to utilize to the fullest extent of funding allowed and determined by the Department of Housing and Urban Development, under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, and to act as the authorized representative of the Township of Parsippany-Troy Hills and to provide such additional information as may be required.
2. The Mayor and other appropriate and responsible officials are hereby authorized and directed to execute on behalf of the Township such certification or certifications as may be required under the Rules and Regulations of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Discussion:

- **Craftsman Farms Foundation Request for Funding:** Ms. Lim re-iterated the memo she had sent to the Council regarding this project. Craftsman Farms is requesting a total of \$520,000. She is proposing that \$200,000 be allocated from the Historic Preservation pot which presently has a balance of \$567,000, which is replenished annually with \$95,000. The remaining \$320,000, or less if she can locate unspent funds from previous resolutions related to Craftsman Farms, would come from the Parks portion of the Open Space Trust Fund. The Parks portion of the Open Space has a sizable balance of about \$1.8 million. They are currently proposing \$1 million as a down payment this year for the Parks Improvement Project. They would still leave a good amount of money in both pots. Mr. Ferrara asked what the \$320,000 would be used for. A representative from Craftsman Farms responded that the \$320,000 is to seed money to restore and do rehabilitation on a building known as the “White Cottage.” The entire project is estimated to be between \$1.1 and \$1.2 million. They are fully committed to raising the balance on their own. The project itself would place their administrative offices upstairs and the downstairs will be a resource center which will mainly be a library and house archival materials. **ON***

The Township Council informally voted to include this request as a resolution on next week’s Consent Agenda.

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- Baldwin House: Mr. Nelson asked Ms. Lim if there is money to board up the upstairs of the Baldwin House which has mostly broken windows. Ms. Lim responded that in the same memo she sent to the Council regarding Craftsman Farms, she had mentioned that Mr. Gabe Yaccorino had requested some funding for some of the other historic sites including the Baldwin House.

Engineering Report of May 2013

Status of Road Resurfacing-Puddingstone Area

The Developer has installed a water main and sanitary sewer line on a portion of Puddingstone Road. We have been working with the developer and will make temporary improvements until the sanitary sewer line is turned over to the Township. A meeting has taken place with the developer but there has been no resolution at this time. **(No Change) NEXT AGENDA**

Revisions to Escrow Requirements in Connection with Residential Sidewalk/Driveway Repairs

The Lau's have expressed their unhappiness with the Township over the escrow fee and their belief that it is unnecessary and onerous on residents. Former Township Engineer Michael Pucilowski wanted to review the ordinance and draft changes to reduce the amount of escrow required for work performed between the property line and the edge of pavement in the Township right-of-way however this was not accomplished before his retirement.

We recently received a letter from Mr. & Mrs. Fraga also expressing their displeasure with the escrow requirement and with the burden on the property owner to request the return of escrow funds. Many people do not request their escrow back after one year. In an effort to help residents the Engineering and Finance offices have been compiling a list of right-of-way escrows that have not been returned.

I met with Michael Pucilowski and asked for his aid in reviewing the ordinances and making recommendations. Recommendations will be presented. **(No Change). NEXT AGENDA**

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Canterbury Estates Vacation of Lots 26 and 77 in Block 98

The applicant of Canterbury Estates has requested the vacation of Lot 26 in Block 98. This lot was apparently created as an access route to Lot 77 which was reserved for a future water tower. I take no objection to the vacation of the entire Lot 26 from Foote Lane to Lot 77. Please refer to my May 5, 2009 memo on this subject. The metes and bounds descriptions have been reviewed and were sent back to the attorney for revisions. Once acceptable an Ordinance will need to be adopted by the Township Council to vacate this right-of-way. **(No Change) NEXT AGENDA**

Glacier Hills Sidewalk

Questions have arisen about the annual sidewalk replacement project which included locations in the Glacier Hills section of town last year. Property owners are responsible for the maintenance and replacement of sidewalk along the frontage of their property however, the Township is responsible for repair/replacement if the damaged is caused by a Township tree. The annual project is for the replacement of curb & sidewalk damaged by trees in the Township right of way. This office is evaluating the quality of work completed at the end of last year and any corrective action needed will be addressed once the project begins again this spring. **(No Change) NEXT AGENDA**

No Parking-Springhill Drive

This office has received a request from the Glenmont Commons Homeowner's Association requesting a no parking zone on either side of the driveway leading to the community pool. The Police Department and this office have investigated this request and it was determined that parking should be prohibited on either side of the driveway in order to allow for better sight distance. **An ordinance must be adopted by the Township Council. INTRODUCTION – ON**

- Roy Messmer, 10 Drumlin Dr: asked if the blue collar contract has been ratified; stated that he agreed with the Council person on the issue of merit raises (Mayor Barberio responded that the members ratified the contract and it will be discussed with the Council in Closed Session this evening); asked why the comparison list of the off-duty police

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officers rate of pay given by the Administration to the Council is different from the numbers that Mr. Nelson researched (Ms. Lim responded she was given the list by the police department); spoke highly of the open house for Livingston House and encouraged the Council Members to attend.

- Lorrie Cancillieri, 242 Pitman Rd: read a statement regarding her objections to the rezoning of the Waterview property which centered around water quality issues and the environment.
- Lorraine Straus, 8 Robert St: brought concerns about her neighbor's house, 6 Roberts Street which is being used as a boarding house. The rooms are being rented out individually and there is an increase in traffic. She and her neighbors who are also present this evening are concerned about safety issues for their neighborhood. Mayor Barberio said he will speak to her in depth after the meeting.
- Sigmund Balaban, 10 Grecian St: expressed his objections to the proposed Waterview project. His main concern is with the developers handling of the issue and the letter they sent. He also expressed concerns about the attorney's representation and his displeasure with the Township Council.
- Richard Brot, 7 Robert St: wished to re-iterate what Lorraine said and asked if the Mayor will be meeting with all the neighbors from Robert St after the meeting. Mayor Barberio responded in the affirmative.
- Pat Petaccia, 182 Hawkins Ave: brought 3 concerns: the waiving of the \$132,000 water/sewer bill for the Knoll Country Club; use of water/sewer surplus money to balance the budget; asked what is in the budget for Open Space this year and asked that Open Space meetings be placed on the website and objects to the building of another turf field.

The Mayor and Council debated the pros and cons of using water/sewer surplus to balance the budget.

- Jerry Manning, 3 Oakdale: Spoke in support of the Waterview project and spoke about the attorney as the arbiter of Roberts Rules of Order.
- Samuel Poff, 203 Flemington: (President of the Parsippany Blue Collars Union) complained about how he felt was mistreatment and intimidation by the Mayor in the negotiation process. Mayor Barberio responded to misconceptions and felt this could have been resolved much sooner than it was. .
- Aida Visakay, 4 Fox Chase Dr: asked if the trees that fell from the storm will be replaced. Mayor Barberio responded that he will look into it and get back to her.

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- Warren Singer, 23 Homes St: expressed his concerns about the Waterview Project and the spoke about standards of freedom of speech at Council Meetings. Asked that the Council look out for the residents and not the interests of the developer.
