## Mayor Barberio's Weekly Update

On behalf of the Township of Parsippany-Troy Hills, Mayor Barberio emotionally expressed his gratitude for the sacrifices they made to give us the freedom to hold events such as these. On Tuesday August 1, 2017 members of Parsippany Fire Prevention attended National Night Out held at Mennen Arena in Morris Township and sponsored by the Morris County Park Police. Parsippany Fire Prevention brought the Township smoke trailer and Bullex Fire Extinguisher system. Throughout the night, an estimated 400-450 attendees participated in learning about fire safety at home including kitchen safety, bedroom safety, meeting locations, and received handouts regarding space heaters, smoke detectors, carbon monoxide detectors, dryer safety, and dormitory safety for those heading to college in the fall. Attendees also had the opportunity to use a fire extinguisher on a controlled fire to demonstrate the proper way to utilize a fire extinguisher if the need arises.

Please remember: Smoke Detectors Save Lives. If you do not have smoke detectors inside your home, install them! ## Mount Tabor's 24th Annual Victorian House Tour

The Mount Tabor Historical Society's annual House Tour will take place on Saturday, September 30, 2017. The self-guided tour will be held rain or shine 11am to 4pm.

The Annual House Tour of the Mount Tabor Historic District allows visitors to get an inside look at the unique charm of this historic community, with more than 15 private houses and historic buildings open to the public. Special features include a furnished replica Camp Meeting Tent and the Richardson History House, a camp meeting cottage museum. Stop by the gift shop, which is stocked with Mount Tabor souvenirs and vintage items.

Step inside the replica Camp Meeting Tent and sample traditional tent life for yourself. You may find it just as charming today as when it was described in the Tabor Record August 1881: "Many delight in the freedom, the light and the air, that a canvas house affords, and hold that half the attraction of the place is in the wholesome outdoor life they lead, sleeping with but a film of cotton between them and the dews of heaven".



Parking will be provided at the Mount Tabor School, located on Park Road, Morris Plains, off Route 53 (GPS: use 864 Park Rd. Morris Plains) where a shuttle bus will be available for transport into the heart of Mount Tabor. Mount Tabor is located in Morris County along Route 53 between Denville and Morris Plains. Visitors who prefer mass transit can take the NJ Transit Morris & Essex line to the Mount Tabor stop.
